No Opting Out No Trial Period

- There is no ability to "opt out" of the union if nurses unionize.
- Nurses would have to follow any negotiated labor contract even if that means losing benefits or other conditions of employment that they now have.
- Plus, with a union security clause, a union would require nurses to pay dues or fees just to keep their job at MedStar Georgetown University Hospital.
- If nurses unionize, the union is permanent unless they attempt the difficult process to remove a union, called "decertification."

Here's how the decertification process works:







Wait at least
ONE YEAR before
attempting to
remove a union.

If a contract is reached, it could be up to **THREE YEARS** before attempting to remove a union.

If the window for filing is missed, it could be up to another **THREE YEARS** before trying again.

Even if filed on time, nurses must first gather signatures from a majority of the bargaining unit to request a decertification vote — and then win majority support in that vote to remove the union.



If you sign a union authorization card, you could be stuck with a union for a long time.
